



PREFACE


This is the first ever such Annual Report, in the last 26 years, which we are publishing in the absence of Shri. Krishnaji Laxamn allies Kishabhau Patwardhan; the founder of 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee. While working in a private school as a teacher and then as Head Master, Late Shri. Kishabhau always thought of starting an activity for the integrated development of students, especially from the down trodden strata of the society. His dream for such an activity turned into reality when he started 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee, in the year 1979, immediately on his retirement. He literally nurtured the activity for a period of 25 years.

Due to old age Shri. Kishabhau Patwardhan passed away on 29th July, 2004. He was a visionary. He motivated his students and volunteers, right from the first day, in such a way that the activities of 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee should run smoothly, even in his absence. Now the burden to prove his motive lies on the whole team of volunteers. We are confident that we shall run the activities in the same spirit and also will be able to expand them keeping the ideals of our founder always before us. Rather, this will be a true homage to him.

We are presenting the Annual work Report for the year 2004. We shall be glad to receive your suggestions reactions, if any.



Homage To The Founder of the Trust



'Swa'-Roopwardhinee is the brainchild of Shri. Krishnaji Laxman allies Kishabhau Patwardhan, a great humanist and visionary, call him a clairvoyant. It was sad he passed away, due to old age on 29th July,2004 This is a big loss to all of us. The real shraddhanjali is to carry out his sacred mission with redoubled vigour.

Late Shri, Kishabhau on his retirement in December, 1978 invited some of his close friends, namely Shri.P.V.Shroff (industrialist & educationist), Shri.K.G.Lavlekar (An educationist and social worker). Shri.Shrikant Samal (A leading Builder) Shri.Kanchan G. Shah, (Businessman & social worker), Late Shri.Annasaheb Gogawale(Building Contractor & social worker) etc. He wanted all of them to involve in his dream of uplifting the children belonging to the weaker sections of the society, through informal educational activity. He formed a core group with their

help and threw himself for this cause. Thus was born 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee. Late Shri.Kishabhau also travelled a lot to Mumbai and established rapport with great personalities like Shri.Jaisingbhai Mariwala, who is now shouldering the responsibility as President of 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee.

His contribution in starting various informal educational programmes has resulted in creating capable young team of volunteers who are motivated properly for social service. The young team of volunteers, who joined Wardhinee as a student when they were in std. 5th, are now shouldering responsibility in the day to day functioning of the activities Till his last breath, late Shri.Patwardhan was active for 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee. He was honoured with number of awards, for his invaluable contribution in the field of social work, including the FIE Foundation Award in the year 1996.

- ★ Left the college education for joining the freedom fight movement in 1942
- Worked as a full time worker(Pracharak) for R.S.S. during the period 1945 to 1951

- ★ Voluntarily worked for Vivekananda Kendra-Kanyakumari, Ramkrishna Math-Pune.
- ☆ Right from the inception, worked for a period of 12 years voluntarily for Jnana-Prabodhinee. Worked as a Liaison Officer for Jnana-Prabodhinee
- ★ Just on the next day of his retirement, i.e. 1.1.1979, started working for the innovative idea of informal educational activity in his mind. This resulted in inception of 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee on 13th May, 1979.
- ★ Devoted his whole time, energy,& money only for 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee.
- ★ Due to his incredible efforts the activity of Wardhinee not only survived but expanded in multiple directions.

- ★ It is the result of his untiring efforts that Wardhinee could construct its own five storied building, without any loan, in the year 1988.

Dr. Banubai Coyajee was a prominent social worker in the field of health and family planning. She was honoured with Padmabhushan Award by Govt. of India. She was also the recipient of the internationally recognised 'Magassasey

Award' for her invaluable contribution in the field of health. She expired on 15th July, 2004, due to old age.

She was an Honourable Member of 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee and was instrumental in starting the Mother & Child Care Centre as well as the Home Nursing Course in Wardhinee. Due to her strong recommendation the JRD & Thelma Tata Trust donated a Mobile Van to Wardhinee for its Mobile Laboratory & Rural Development Project.

We as well as the society as a whole has lost a great humanist active social worker, May her soul rest in peace.

Annual Work Report

Integrated Development Centers(Shakha Vibhag)

Cultural

Festival of Makar Sankranti:

The Montessori and Bal Vibhag celebrated the Sankranti Utsav on 17th of January, 2004. Renowned Poet Dr.Smt.Sangeeta Barve was the Chief Guest. The kids performed the demonstrations which



included folk dances, action Songs, drama etc. The Chief Guest congratulated the kids and their teachers for the excellent programmes; especially the drama on the subject 'Save the Nature' and the method of presenting yearly report through dialogs. The Chief Guest put her speech through her own motivational poems.

Renowned writer Dr.Anand Yadav was the Chief Guest for the Sankranti Utsav of the Shakha & Prakalp Vibhag which took place on the 25th of January, 2004. Taking into consideration the silver jubilee year of the trust, the development of the trust right from the beginning was demonstrated through a drama by the students and volunteers. The Chief Guest raised the problems being faced by the metropolitan cities like Pune including the problem of



slums, and said that unless we go the root cause of such problems in the society, we will not be able to find out right solutions. On this back- ground, he patted 'Swa'-Rooopwardhinee for its role in the field of informal education and that too for students from underprivileged strata of the society.

Ganesh Festival:

Wardhinee is participating in this main social festival for the last more than 20 years. This participation is with a special purpose. The students can interact with the society easily and can observe the 'good and bad', 'right and wrong' traditions in the festival. While becoming a part of the society's festival, Wardhinee arranges programmes like Street Play, through which we try to spread message of unity, integrity etc. This year the following programmes were the part of this festival-

a) Street Play b) Atharwashirsha c) Solving 21 mathematical problems everyday for 10 days, d) Training Programme for Ganesh Idol Pooja & Pranpratistha e) Participation in the procession for Ganesh Idol Emersion

Educational

Daily Routine:

The daily working of all the branches is uniform. Monday to Friday the branches





work three hours in the evening between 6.00 to 9.00p.m. This schedule is divided for physical training and scholastic coaching. On Saturdays and Sundays, along with the routine schedule of physical training, other programmes for motivational training are planned. These programmes include Lectures, Manasik Vikas Baithak, Group Tasks etc.

Well Done My Boys

The Chairman of the trust, Shri.P.V.Shroff was speaking to the students of Wardhinee while felicitating the students who achieved excellent

marks in their respective annual examinations. 105 students from Std.3rd to Post Graduations were felicitated



at this function which was held on 5th September' 04. While patting them for their excellent success, he stressed the need to develop habit of versatile reading, imbibe hobbies like learning at least one foreign language, wandering and observing the things happening in the Nature etc.

On this occasion, the three branches which started last year were named after Swami Dayand Saraswati, Swami Bramhanand, & Maharshi Shraddhanand

Residential Camps:

Residential camps are organised in the summer and Diwali vacations every year. This gives an opportunity for the organizers to observe the students. The students on the other side, while enjoying the central theme subject of the camp, learn to how to live with others, develop a mental set up to accept adjustments self discipline, etc. This

year the following camps were organized for different age groups.

Know Thy Neighbour...Help Thy Neighbour: The main theme of the camp was to make the Wardhinee students aware as to how their brethren from draught affected areas live, what are the hardships in their day to day life, how we can save every drop of water, and how we can be of some use to them. During this camp, students lived in four draught affected villages from Satara District and worked with the villagers to dig small trenches for collecting rain water in the coming Monsoon.

<u>Learning skills in story telling and tele</u> <u>games</u>: This camps was organized for students of age group 5 to 9.

Freedom_Fighters.....The true heroes of the Nation: This theme of the camp was arranged for the students from Std. 5th to 7th. The students were highly impressed to hear the life stories of revolutionaries like Swatantryaveer Savarkar, Anant Kanhere, Lalit Badphukan etc. At the concluding ceremony of this camp, the revolutionary Shri.Bindumadhav Joshi, who fought to free Dadra-Nagar Haveli area from the Portuguese, was the Chief Guest. He narrated the whole story of the fight. His speech was quite inspiring and the students could understand what the freedom fighters might have endured while fighting for nation.

Good Health...The key to successful life: This camp was arranged only for girl students. Eye check up, Dental check up programmes were organized during the





camp. The girl participants were given guidance in the subjects like how to maintain good health, what are the precautions that the girls from adolescent age group should take etc.

Do the experiment yourselves: 235 boys and girl students from std. 5th to 10th were selected for this camp. Various scientific experiments were arranged for the students



to do it for themselves. While enjoying the experiments, the students were trying to understand the true scientific reasons behind the experiments. Group Tasks were also given to them to develop team spirit. Scientific Toys from U.S.A. was also the attraction of the camp. On an average every participant could do 15 to 16 experiments during the camp. Retired Scientist from N.C.L. Shri.Pramod Moghe was the Chief Guest at the concluding ceremony.

Camp to search sport talents: 70 boys from various branches of Wardhinee were selected for this sport talent search camp. It was arranged at the Sports School of Jnanaprabodhinee, Nigdi. The participants were given basic skill training in Athletics,

Gymyastic, Mallakhamb and Wrestling.

Social

Blood Donation Camp & Drinking Water Booth

Every year we celebrate Dr, Babasaheb Ambedkar Jayanti, by organizing a Blood Donation Camp. 72 bags of blood were collected this year and donated to Janakalyan Blood Bank.

Side by side, students from Std.5th to 7th of 'Aajol' project, distributed drinking water to



those who came to visit the monument of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar. on his birth anniversary. This year over 6000 people

visited the booth.

Tree Plantation Programme: The students and volunteers from Ramkrishan Shakha had arranged a programme to plant 50 saplings of various trees at Tukai Hill at Hadapsar, just before the Monsoon started.





<u>Human Resource Development</u> Meetings to Plan the work:

Two meetings for yearly planning were arranged. The main volunteers from every branch were invited for these meetings. In the first meeting, stress was given on their personal planning. In the second meeting, discussions were held collectively and branch-wise separately to decide the yearly plan of all the branches and 'Swa'-Roopwardhinee as a whole.

Training Programme:

Whole Day Training Programmes were organized thrice in the year. This training programme was arranged for all the volunteers, from the branches as well as all the projects. The following subjects were part of these training programmes-

Skills in Reading & Writing, Planning, What is meant by 'Personality Development'? Why is it necessary ?, Know Yourself, Experience sharing by volunteers working for Nomadic Tribes etc.

Publicity Front:

On 7th August,2004, Pune Centre of All India Radio broadcast the interview of our office bearers and volunteers which included Shri.S.R.Patwardhan,S.V.Tambat, Mrs.Rohini Dighe, Miss.Vidya Kudlingar, Mr.Santosh Lokhande and Mr.Sandeep More.

Office bearers and volunteers toured Rajasthan and Delhi, with an aim of spreading wardhinee activities outside Maharashtra. Shri.D.N.Purandare and Smt.Pushpa Nade visited Jodhpur whereas Shri.S.R.Patwardhan and Shri. Umesh Bibwe visited Delhi. All of them talked to local volunteers from various NGO, shared views regarding the 'Wardhinee Experiment', explained the idea behind this project and assured them all sort of co-operation.

This year the project covered12 villages of Mulshi Tehesil. Students of std.5th to 7th were given guidance in scholastic subjects like English, Maths. & Science. The students were given opportunity to do the scientific experiments as per their syllabus. The teachers of this project showed some funny experiments also to develop their interest in the subject.


Additionally, following activities took place during the year:

* Residential Camps -

One day camp was organized in five villages namely Tamhinee, Aasde, Walen, Sutarwadi and Kolvan. Programmes like Funny Scientific Experiments, Origami were the main attraction of the camp. 105 students participated in the camp.

- ** Exhibtion: Exhibtion of funny experiements was arranged for three days in New Eng. School, Tilak Road, during the Ganesh Festival. 2500 people visited the exhibition and enjoyed the experiments
- * Lab. For the surrounding schools: This year this experiment was done on trial basis.

Wardhinee has its own premises in Mangalwar Peth. Wardhinee offered special lab facility for the selected students of the schools in the surrounding areas. Students from std. 5th to 7th selected by their respective schools visited Wardhinee lab.on the days allotted to them. Scientific experiments, other than the syllabus, is the main attraction of the project. The students from three private schools in the area participated and tried to learn the principles behind the experiments.





Montessori School:

Vocational Training Courses:

Vocational training is very essential for the economic self reliance of women. 50 needy ladies successfully completed the training under the courses of Home Nursing & Sewing.

Literacy Class-

Two centres, one at Bheemnagar & other at Ambedkar Samajmandir were run during the whole year. 40 ladies were benefited.

Operation Eye Sight-

This project is run in co-operation with Jnanaprabodhinee Medical Trust. This project is run in 13 slums in the surrounding area. The main object of this project is-

- □ to detect eye sight problems in children between 0 to 5 years.
- ☐ to educate parents (especially the mothers) for proper nutrition,

Harmony Groups-

As a part of silver jubilee year, last year, harmony groups of women were formed.

The idea of forming such group was to give platform to all the women who are in





contact with Wardhinee, (either through various vocational courses and other services), to come forward and express their views on variousubjects, of their own interest or in the social interest. The first anniversary of all these groups was celebrated on 11th of December'04. Seventy five women participated in this function.

Smt.Asha Bapat, a women activist from Jnanaprabodhinee was the Chief Guest.

Special Programmes during the Year

Invaluable Contributions of the Commons

-We celebrate the Bharatiya New Year on the auspicious day of Warshapratipada. By organizing chanting of Omkar –Gayatri Mantra in the early hours of the day at 6.00a.m.

Braving cold students/volunteers participate with full enthusiasm. A meeting follows this meditation. The Chief Guest was Shri Hastimalji. He has devoted his entire life for the R.S.S. work: He is a very knowledgeable and an absorbing orator. By citing various historical instances, he conveyed how common man confronted with challenges behaves and performs extraordinary acts. History is replete with such performance, e.g. the sacrifice of Panna Dai Runawat Hadi Rani, & Bhamashah of Rajasthan and appealed the students and volunteers to execute such behaviour.

The Darkness in the life of the Tribal and The Ray Of Hope

Tribal apathy is our biggest concern, even after 58 years of independence. Tribals have no access to proper food or clothing, and live a miserable life. No wonder they become alcoholic. Wardhinee volunteers visited Jawhar and Mokhada Tehesil to observe and study this problem in November 2004. In spite of various Govt. Programmes, much needs to be done. Fortunately many NGO are now seized with the problem and our volunteers were glad to see their work. Salutation to Kargil Hero



As a part of silver jubilee celebration, a special programme was organized by Wardhinee. A special show of the film on Kargil War, namely 'LOC Kargil' was arranged by Wardhinee for soldiers from Pune Base Camps. The slides he exhibited immencely added to the knowledge of the audience. His ardent appeal to the youths to join military services was quite effective.







Financial Position

The organizers who run NGO are required to fight on many fronts at a time. Defeat or retreat on any front affects the other fronts also, directly or indirectly. The show of a NGO is run on how much fund they collect. Even though funds are collected, the changes in the Govt. Policy has its impact-positive or negative on the running of the NGO. Considering all these factors, if we look into the position on financial front during the year 2003-04, we can say as under:-

We could collect funds to the tune of Rs.21,34,514/-by way of donations, fees etc. This collection of funds helped us to

fulfil our requirement for revenue expenditure.


The total expenditure during the financial year 2003-04 was Rs.25,00,291/-. Out of this, the division of direct expenditure is as under -

Expenditure on Objects of the trust: Rs.14,72,381.08 (72.54%)

Expenditure on Administration of the trust: Rs. 4,25,437.70 (20.96%)

Expenditure for silver jubilee programmes: Rs. 1,31,973.00 (6.5%)











Expansion of the work involves increase in expenditure. Inflation is continuously on rise. Voluntary organisations like us, working without any Govt. financial support, face number of problems due to increase in inflation and expenditure. Naturally those who have offered their voluntary services to the organisation have to spare all their energy in raising more and more funds in order to cover the additional expenditure. Of course, philanthropic individuals, industries, trusts and foundations have always come forward with their generous monetory help. It is, however, absolutely become necessary to create a fairly good Corpus Fund to look after the day to day needs of the organisation, as well as for the future expansion.
